Centers are looking for donations of all different types of blood but as of right now, there's a critical shortage of O negative – the universal donor. 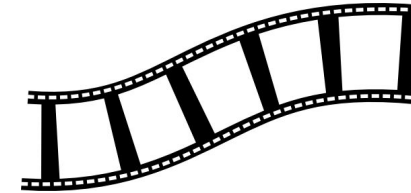
NOT GREEN COFFEE. JUST COFFEE THAT IS GREEN.
